# INTRODUCTION TO THE OPEN

The Open, the three-day Cheltenham meeting which kick starts the jump season, has record prize money in 2009 of just under £700,000, with the feature Paddy Power Gold Cup worth a massive £150,000.

Staged on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, November 13 to 15, The Open is the second highest-profile meeting at Cheltenham and a huge event in its own right.

It represents three days of the best that racing has to offer and is the biggest and most important meeting of the first half of the jump season - a weekend of entertainment, sport and fun not to be missed, including 80 trade stands in The Open shopping village.

The Open provides thrilling competition between many of the best jump horses in Europe, with crowds over the three days of up to 70,000.

Thomas Pink, the leading international luxury shirt brand and former sponsor of the Paddy Power Gold Cup, returns to Cheltenham to sponsor the awards for both the top jockey and top trainer The Open. Racegoers and television viewers alike will be able to spot the jockey who is leading the standings at any stage, as they will be wearing a pink armband during any races in which they take part. Thomas Pink will also sponsor the awards for leading trainer and jockey at The Festival in 2010.

## FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 13, 2009

Friday is the hugely popular Countryside Raceday, with a traditional country fair atmosphere. Add in the thrills of top-class racing, the season's first Glenfarclas Cross Country Steeplechase over a unique course combining hedges, banks and timber rails and you have a sporting day out which is normally enjoyed by in excess of 20,000 people.

## SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 14, 2009

## SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 15, 2009

Sunday's feature is the highly competitive Greatwood Handicap Hurdle, worth £100,000, which is almost always won by a rising star of the hurdling world. Sunday will also feature the first running of the £50,000 Connaught Chase, a two-mile event which could see the seasonal reappearance of the dual Seasons Holidays Queen Mother Champion Chase victor, Master Minded.

# PADDY POWER GOLD CUP HISTORY

The Paddy Power Gold Cup is a great race with an illustrious history. The 2m 4.5f contest was first run in 1960 and the race has seen many well-known chasers in action.

One of the best performances in the handicap chase came in 1965 from Dunkirk, who carried a massive 12st 7lb to victory and there have been plenty of other memorable renewals.

The Paddy Power Gold Cup has been won by Irish-trained horses on four occasions. Fortria took the initial running and was successful for a second time two years later in 1962.

The Irish had to wait for more than a decade for a further winner, which came in the shape of Skymas in 1973, and Bright Highway was the last successful horse from the Emerald Isle in 1980, when winning by seven lengths.

Gay Trip's two victories formed part of Fred Rimell's extraordinary training feat when he sent out the winner four years in a row. Jupiter Boy in 1968 and Chatham in 1970 completed Rimell's quartet. Gay Trip won the 1970 Grand National in between his Cheltenham successes

Celestial Gold proved his stamina with a subsequent one and a half length victory over Ollie Magern in the Hennessy Cognac Gold Cup, which saw him become the fourth horse, along with Red Candle (1972), Bachelor's Hall (1977) and Bright Highway (1980), to add the Newbury prize to his Cheltenham victory.

Two and a half-mile specialists like the dual winner Half Free, handled by Fred Winter, who trained three winners of the race, and Dublin Flyer (1995) have triumphed, while Skymas (1973) won the Queen Mother Champion Chase twice.

Tony McCoy is the most successful jockey in the history of the Paddy Power Gold Cup with four victories. The record-breaking rider triumphed on Cyfor Malta in 1998 and followed up two years later aboard Lady Cricket. He went on to secure a third success in 2001 on Shooting Light and added a fourth aboard Exotic Dancer in 2006.

Richard Linley and Richard Dunwoody, who both achieved three victories during their riding careers, are the next most successful jockeys in the Paddy Power Gold Cup.

Linley was victorious on Fifty Dollars More in 1982 and Half Free in 1984 and 1985, while Dunwoody gained his wins on Very Promising in 1986, Another Coral in 1991 and Challenger Du Luc in 1996.

Ferdie Murphy and Graham Lee enjoyed their first Paddy Power Gold Cup victory, when L'Antartique got the better of Il Duce by a neck in a cracking finish in 2007. There were 20 runners, the highest number since 1983.

Our Vic provided trainer Martin Pipe with his eighth Paddy Power Gold Cup success in 2006 when the seven-year-old, partnered by Timmy Murphy, came home two and a half lengths clear of Monkerhostin.

Pipe's superb record had previously seen him win the Paddy Power Gold Cup with Beau Ranger (1987), Challenger Du Luc (1996), Cyfor Malta (1998 & 2002), Lady Cricket (2000), Shooting Light (2001) and Celestial Gold (2004).

Pipe handed over the reins to his son David at the end of the 2005/2006 season and the rookie trainer almost continued the winning tradition in 2006 when Vodka Bleu finished the three-length second to the Jonjo O'Neill-trained Exotic Dancer, who came from last to first under Tony McCoy.

In 2002 the Pipe-trained Cyfor Malta, a horse whose racing career had been dogged by injury problems, stormed back to the form he had shown in his younger days with a second win in the Paddy Power Gold Cup - four years after his initial success in the first big handicap chase of the season.

This made him the fifth horse to win the race twice, following Fortria (1960 and 1962), Gay Trip (1969 and 1971), Half Free (1984 and 1985) and Bradbury Star (1993 and 1994).

Shooting Light was brilliantly ridden by champion jockey Tony McCoy to defeat 13 talented chasers in 2001. Lady Cricket was impressive when scoring by 10 lengths from stable companion Exit Swinger in 2000, with another five lengths back to the third in a 15-strong field. The enigmatic Challenger Du Luc scored a cheeky head success over Strong Promise in 1996 while in 1987 Beau Ranger came home 15 lengths in front under Mark Perrett.

The popularity of Cheltenham's Open Meeting increases each year with the Irish. One of the great strengths of the three days is the relationship which draws Irish-trained horses and racegoers. Last year there were 43 Irish runners over the three days, including three winners. But an Irish-trained winner of the Paddy Power Gold Cup has not come along for some time.

In the 1990s, Toranfield (1991) and Second Schedules (1994) came second, and Anabatic was fourth in 1996, while Feathered Leader finished third in 2000.

Last year saw Imperial Commander, partnered by Paddy Brennan, get the better of the Queen's Barbers Shop by two and three-quarter lengths. It was a second victory in the Paddy Power Gold Cup for local Naunton handler Nigel Twiston-Davies, who previously scored with Tipping Tim in 1992. Imperial Commander returned to Cheltenham the following March for The Festival and was successful in the Grade One Ryanair Chase.

# FACTS & FIGURES ABOUT THE PADDY POWER GOLD CUP & THE OPEN

This year sees the 50th renewal of the Paddy Power Gold Cup, boasting a prize fund of £150,000. The race, run under its present title for the first time in 2003, was known as the Thomas Pink Gold Cup from 2000-2002 while Whitbread, under their Mackeson brand and then subsequently Murphys, backed the first 40 runnings.

\*\*\*\*

Since the inaugural running in 1960, the handicap chase has been won by Irish-trained horses on four occasions. Fortria won the first running and was successful for a second time two years later in 1962. The Irish had to wait for more than a decade for a further winner which came in the shape of Skymas in 1973, and Bright Highway was the last successful horse from the Emerald Isle in 1980.

\*\*\*\*

Over the three days of The Open last season, there were three Irish-trained winners from 43 runners.

\*\*\*\*

Five horses have won the Paddy Power Gold Cup twice. Fortria was the first, then Gay Trip completed the double in 1969 and 1971, with his victory in the 1970 Grand National sandwiched in between. Half Free was successful in 1984 and the following year, while Bradbury Star achieved the feat for Findon-based handler Josh Gifford in 1993 and 1994. Cyfor Malta, the 1998 winner, triumphed four years later in 2002.

\*\*\*\*

Martin Pipe, now retired, has been the leading trainer in the Paddy Power Gold Cup, having saddled an amazing eight winners - Beau Ranger (1987), Challenger Du Luc (1996), Cyfor Malta (1998 & 2002), Lady Cricket (2000), Shooting Light (2001), Celestial Gold (2004) and Our Vic (2005). Nigel Twiston-Davies, who scored with Tipping Tim in 1992 and Imperial Commander in 2008, is the only current handler with more than one victory.

\*\*\*\*

Despite the competitiveness of the Paddy Power Gold Cup, it is not a race for outsiders as 33 of the 49 runnings have been won by horses returned at odds of 15/2 or less. However, the overall record of favourites is not great, with only 13 having been successful during the history of the race. Four of the last nine runnings have gone to the market leaders, with the latest being Our Vic in 2006. The shortest-priced winner was Dunkirk who went off the 11/10 favourite in 1965, while the two longest-priced scorers were Chatham (1970) and Senor El Betrutti (1997), both returned at 33/1.

\*\*\*\*

Perhaps the greatest performance in the history of the contest was achieved by Dunkirk, who carried a staggering 12st 7lb to victory when he gained his 1965 success.

\*\*\*\*

Josh Gifford is the only man to have both ridden and trained a winner of the Paddy Power Gold Cup, partnering Charlie Worcester to victory in 1967 and training Bradbury Star for his successes in 1993 and 1994.

The incomparable Arkle made his British racecourse bow in the Honeybourne Chase on the Saturday of The Open in 1962. It was a fantastic day for Arkle's trainer and jockey, Tom Dreaper and Pat Taaffe, who, following Arkle's impressive destruction of the opposition by 20 lengths, went on to land what is now the Paddy Power Gold Cup with Fortria.

\*\*\*\*

Best Mate, the latest horse to win three totesport Cheltenham Gold Cups, won his first race under Rules in Britain when taking the Open Bumper in 1999 and recorded the second chase win of his career at The Open in 2000, while the 2003 Smurfit Kappa Champion Hurdle victor Rooster Booster defied top-weight to win the Greatwood Handicap Hurdle in 2002. The 2001 Greatwood Handicap Hurdle winner, Westender, was second to Rooster Booster in the 2003 Smurfit Champion Hurdle.

\*\*\*\*

Two of the last three winners of the £100,000 Greatwood Hurdle, Detroit City (2006) and Sizing Europe (2007) have both started favourite for the Smurfit Kappa Champion Hurdle at The Festival in the same season, only to disappoint. However, the 2007 Greatwood second Osana ran much better in the 2008 Smurfit Kappa Champion Hurdle, finishing runner-up.

\*\*\*\*

The Open has only once been held at an alternative venue to Prestbury Park. In 1976 a new drainage system was being installed at Cheltenham, so the then two-day meeting was switched to Haydock Park where Cancellor became the only horse to win the Paddy Power Gold Cup anywhere but Cheltenham.

# TWISTON-DAVIES LEADS THE TRAINERS AT THE OPEN

With two successes over the three days in 2008, local handler Nigel Twiston-Davies leads the race to be the winning-most current trainer at The Open, one ahead of Paul Nicholls. Philip Hobbs is third with 16 wins at the meeting.

## McCOY OUT IN FRONT

Champion Tony McCoy is the most successful current jockey at The Open, with 39 wins under his belt, five of which were achieved in 1999, two in 2000, seven in 2001, five in 2002, four in 2003, one in 2004, three in 2005 and two in 2006 and 2007. Amazingly, he failed to register a victory last year although he ride three seconds.

Timmy Murphy was the leading jockey at the 2005 Open with four successes, while Ruby Walsh took that accolade in 2006 with six wins, doubling his overall score at the meeting to 12 and went to 13 with a winner in 2007. Paddy Brennan has been leading rider for the past two years, riding two winners on each occasion.

# ABOUT GREATWOOD

## The Greatwood Story

An International League for the Protection of Horses (ILPH) survey revealed that out of the 5,000 or so racehorses that leave racing every year some 400 are at risk. Greatwood joined a committee to discuss with the then British Horseracing Board to put a scheme in place whereby racing could be seen to be responsible for the fate of those racehorses that fall upon hard times.

As life long lovers of horseracing, having owned, ridden and bred, Michael and Helen Yeadon were becoming increasingly concerned as to the fate of racehorses when their racing days were over. The couple used to go to the sales and instead of returning with a well bred mare from which they could breed, they arrived with some poor horse that needed help. Helen remembers asking Michael on one occasion when he arrived home with a skeletal gelding if he had actually remembered the difference between a mare and gelding, thus begun the re-homing side which the Yeadons funded privately for about six years.

A very good friend, a pioneer of horse welfare and Vice President of International League for the Protection Horses persuaded Helen and Michael to start a charity so that they could carry on the work they had started. The couple went on to rescue substantial numbers of horses which for whatever reason had fallen upon hard times; a horse dumped in a scrap yard outside Birmingham, a horse shut in a stable for years, a horse that had been abandoned in a field having been won at cards in a pub.

These are just some of the examples of Greatwood's rescue work. It should be pointed out that Greatwood concentrates upon welfare of the horse at all times never turning away a horse at risk. A significant number of horses need rescuing and although the charity's ultimate aim is to re-home our horses, it must be understood that it takes a lot longer to re-home a rescue case rather than purely the type of horse that has just been retired from racing.

## Greatwood Horse Power

Greatwood was a beautiful old Devon farm from which Helen and Michael derived the name for the charity. It was on one particular occasion in Devon that the idea for Horse Power began to take shape. The couple had been asked if they could help a little girl who had become so withdrawn that she had stopped speaking. When she visited Greatwood, a horse that was in a poor way had just been rescued.

Over the following few weeks the most extraordinary transformation in this child was witnessed.

There was an interaction between the vulnerable child and the rescued racehorse that built both of their confidences up to such an extent that before too long a bubbly little girl would arrive chattering gaily, and a recovering horse would whicker at the sound of her voice.

As Greatwood's work was needed more and more, the charity decided to move, and found a dairy farm near Marlborough in Wiltshire. That, in itself, was a huge upheaval, the removal of dozens of horses, geese, hens, sheep and goats made the actual house move a piece of cake.

Once Greatwood had settled in Wiltshire, it was determined to provide an opportunity for children with special needs to learn life skills and emotional literacy through interaction with rescued former racehorses.

Greatwood has successfully re-homed many rescued racehorses and is happy to report that Horse Power has gone from strength to strength. Luckily, a gifted qualified special needs teacher, Laura Jones, has joined us and has developed the programme content, which has now achieved an accreditation from the Open College Network. Wiltshire County Council and Swindon Borough Council have accredited the Health and Safety, Risk Management and Child Protection procedures.

Greatwood is now working with pupils from all over Wiltshire and Swindon and the feedback from parents and teachers is extremely positive. The work has also been featured on Children In Need.

## JOCKEYS NOW OPTING FOR MUCH WIDER CHOICE OF FURTHER CAREERS

**2009 Griffins Richard Davis Awards shortlists demonstrate increasing diversity**

**Results to be announced at Cheltenham, Sunday 15 November**

The shortlists for this year's Griffins Richard Davis Awards - the JETS' annual career development awards - demonstrate the broad and varying choices made by jockeys when pursuing their careers after retirement from race riding.

- Applicants for the Achievement category - THE GRIFFINS RICHARD DAVIS ACHIEVEMENT AWARD - this year include: a Joiner and Funeral Director (**Paul Robson**), an Accounting Technician and businesswoman (**Claire Bryan**), a Landscaper (**James Diment**), a Tennis Coach (**David Papworth**) and a post-graduate student in Human Geography (**Cheryl Nosworthy**). Also on the shortlist is **Alan Dempsey**, who has opted for a more traditional role as a Stipendiary Steward for the British Horseracing Authority. The Achievement Award goes to the jockey who is judged to have demonstrated the most initiative, effort and forethought in developing a further career.

On the shortlist for THE PROGRESS AWARD (supported by The Injured Jockeys Fund) are three students in the process of full-time study (across very different subjects, from Television Production to Psychology and Equine Science) and two Farrier apprentices. The winner will be the one who the judges feel has made most progress in their career development over the past year.

The Griffins Richard Davis Achievement Award is a £2,500 prize fund to be spent on further career development, generously sponsored by Newbury-based Griffins, accountants and business development consultants to the racing and bloodstock industry. The Progress Award winner will take home a £2,000 prize.

*The winners will be announced and presented with their trophies at an official racecourse presentation in the paddock before racing (12.45pm) at Cheltenham on the Sunday of the Open meeting (15 November). The Griffins Richard Davis Awards Standard Open National Hunt Flat race will be the sixth race on the card that day. Terry Boothby of Griffins will present The Achievement Award and Ian Balding (Injured Jockeys Fund Trustee and Award Judge), The Progress Award.*

"The applicants this year have all shown real commitment to their new career - a sign that jockeys are getting the message that it pays to plan ahead early. The message JETS really needs to get across to jockeys now, is the importance of using their injury time to learn new skills," comments Ian Balding.

The Griffins Richard Davis Achievement Award is judged by a panel of representatives from The Injured Jockeys Fund, The Professional Jockeys Association, JETS, The Racing Post and the sponsors, Griffins. The Progress Award is decided by the Injured Jockeys Fund Almoners and the IJF Deputy Chief Executive, Lisa Hancock.

JETS is jointly funded from jockeys' own prize money contributions and The Injured Jockeys Fund. It typically issues over £70,000 in training grants and scholarships annually. Since its inception in 1995, jockeys and the IJF have together invested over £1million in the scheme which has helped over 700 current and former jockeys with career advice and training in new skills, in order to gain employment after race-riding.
